

Policy Regarding Reference Letters

Preamble: In order to comply with subsection 3.3.0 of the New Brunswick Association of Social Workers By-laws, applicants must provide two letters of references for registration.

Policy

- 1. All references must be submitted on the prescribed form provided by the NBASW (Character Reference Form).
- 2. Originals of the reference forms will be required for final approval for registration and must be signed by the referees.
- 3. References must be sent directly to the NBASW by the referees (by mail, email, or fax).
- 4. At least one letter of reference must be provided by a social worker, preferably one who is registered with the social work regulatory body in the province in which the referee resides and/or works. The other letter of reference, although not having to be provided by a social worker, must be provided by a person familiar with the applicant's practice of social worker so as to be able to complete the form in its entirety.
- 5. In case of a recent graduate, one of the letters of reference must be provided by a social worker who acted as his/her placement supervisor.
- 6. The referees must have worked with the applicant in a professional capacity and observed their work.
- 7. Letters of reference may not be provided by a family member (for example: spouse, partner, parent, son or daughter, sibling, grandparent, etc.), a fellow university classmate, or a friend.
- 8. The Registrar and/or the Committee of Examiners reserve the right to contact the referees for further information if deemed necessary.
- 9. The Committee of Examiners reserves the right to waive these requirements in exceptional circumstances.
